Dear Friend,

We've got a lot going on at Meals on Wheels North Central Texas! I'm going to call it a "growth spurt," because that's exactly what's happening on several fronts:

- 1) We recently **expanded our service area** to include Somervell and Hood counties, so we're now delivering in five counties Johnson, Ellis, Navarro, Somervell, and Hood. According to U.S. Census data, Hood has a population of about 64,000 people; 25.3% are age 65 and up. And Somervell has a population of about 9,400; 19.8% are 65 and up. So, many more seniors to serve!
- 2) **Building With Love** is our ongoing Capital Campaign for our expanding facilities. We've long since outgrown our current space, and construction on a much-needed larger place is well underway. Read all about it on Page 4, and if you haven't already, please consider supporting this vital campaign.
- 3) Our new board chairman, Ken Finch (pictured to the right), is excited about all this growth. "This is a huge opportunity time for leadership," he says. "I want to make a difference, and I like to be a part of making things grow and expand. I am excited about expanding into more counties and look forward to being a part of the future of the organization."

Leslie, his wife, is a retired nurse. She's only 64, and yet says she's "grateful to be alive" after a 2011 stroke resulted in partial paralysis of her vocal cords.

This lovely couple doesn't get around as much as they used to, and when their kids and grandkids aren't around, life is a little slow.

"Sometimes I get bored," says James. His day brightens when volunteers from Meals on Wheels — including Lois, pictured below — arrive. "They always come with a smile."

"Lois is his buddy," Leslie says. "She's always making sure we're here. James socializes with all

the volunteers. Everybody loves James."

Meals on Wheels went the extra mile for James recently when a case manager got him connected with a Life Alert system — putting Leslie's mind at ease.

"We love Meals on Wheels," Leslie says. "They help with so much stuff."

Leslie knows, because she was once one of those helpers. In the 1980s, while working with the Committee on Aging, she helped deliver Meals on Wheels. Now it's her turn.

"We just love this service," Leslie says. "You do so much more than just bring us food."

THE HOMESTRETCH

OUR BUILDING WITH LOVE CAMPAIGN NEEDS YOUR HELP!

t was a beautiful day in the neighborhood when we broke ground on our much-needed expansion project.

The event served as a reminder that we're in the homestretch of our **Building with Love**Capital Campaign ... and we're asking you to join your fellow supporters in carrying us across the finish line. Our goal is to raise \$4.3 million.

Why do we need the expansion, and why now?

At 46 years old, Meals on Wheels North Central Texas has outgrown our current facilities.

We're serving many more people in a much larger area. Our service area has expanded from one county to five in just the last two decades, so

our home base needs to grow accordingly.

Personnel currently share office space, hindering privacy needs for conversations with seniors, donors, family members, and caregivers. The new 7,715-square-foot facility will provide additional office space for existing and much-needed new personnel, as well as a multipurpose room for trainings, workspace for volunteer groups, and the creation of a senior pantry.

We're also installing a 1,600-square-foot freezer, allowing space for all meals needed to serve Johnson, Ellis, Navarro, Somervell, and Hood counties ... while leaving room to grow.

Dia lives with Greg and Carolyn, both 75, who also have a 5-year-old cat named Schrodinger. All four of them — both the humans and the felines — benefit from Meals on Wheels, which includes AniMeals, our program that provides food for pets.

"The cat food really makes a difference," says Greg.

Greg says Meals on Wheels keeps his family from going hungry. He says there have been some weeks where "we wouldn't have been eating if it wasn't for Meals on Wheels."

Greg and Carolyn's son Jason agrees.

"AniMeals helps my parents be able to keep their cats," he says.

Dia perks up when the meals arrive!

Meals on Wheels believes it's important to help seniors who have pets because they make good companions.

"We're a family here," Jason says. "That's me and the cats included. I make ends meet, but Meals on Wheels helps make sure my parents and their cats are taken care of when I can't be here."

DOING DOUBLE THE GOOD THROUGH WALMART VOLUNTEER PROGRAM

Paul was just doing his job at Walmart one day when a manager's call changed his world.

"He asked for volunteers," Paul remembers. "Someone sitting next to me wanted to do it but didn't have a car. So I said I would do it to help."

Before long, Paul was delivering Meals on Wheels as part of Walmart's Volunteerism Always Pays (VAP) program. That was six years ago, and he hasn't stopped since.


He's been driving mostly the same route the whole time, usually making his rounds during his lunch break. He says it takes about an hour a week.

Every time he completes 25 hours, Paul turns in some paperwork to Walmart, which then donates \$250 — \$10 for each hour served — to Meals on Wheels.

In fiscal year 2021, Walmart and Sam's Club associates volunteered more than 278,000 hours through VAP, which translated to more than \$2 million in donations to service organizations.

"It's a really easy way to make a difference," Paul says. "I would volunteer anyway, so why not turn in my hours to help in more than one way."


