Joel fell victim to a scam. As a result, the 82-year-old was unable to afford his electric bill.

Lisa learned on her delivery route that Joel had been living without power — for 12 days.

friends just started donating money, and we had his power covered in no time."

In fact, Joel's power was restored that same day! And the timing couldn't have been better. His power was turned back on right before a big ice storm — potentially saving his life.

What started as a routine visit quickly became a lifesaving situation. Meals on Wheels is truly a lifeline for local seniors because volunteers like Lisa provide so much more than a nutritious meal.
