LETTER FROM THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR



Soon, our Meals on Wheels staff will move into their new home. While we are very excited for the opportunities this will provide, we know the work has just begun. We may be in the homestretch, but we're also back at the starting line.

As you may know, we expanded our service area to include two more counties this last year. But did you know the population of neighbors age 65 and older is projected to increase 32% by 2040? That's a lot of growth! Our mission is to answer the call for all of our underserved neighbors and any senior who needs us, but the need is growing fast.

Getting settled into our new location is the next step in preparing to serve the growing number of seniors in need. It will allow us to be



closer to our existing distribution facility, give us storage space for senior care items and AniMeals products, greatly expand our freezer space, and give us room to house more senior adult resources.

This wouldn't be possible without your support. I just can't thank you enough for your kindness. Your continued gifts to the capital campaign will allow us to keep expanding our services for seniors and provide more of the nutritious foods that our older neighbors need.

A t Meals on Wheels North Central Texas, we aim to nourish every senior adult we serve in more ways than one. We say it's "more than a meal," but what exactly does that mean?

Our home-delivered meal service nourishes the body physically, but the friendly visits and wellness checks nourish the soul and mind while ensuring every senior is safe. We offer support for seniors and caregivers alike, nutritional education, referrals, and assistance to get items like Life Alert buttons, ramps, grab bars, fans, and so much more.

Meals on Wheels and our community of generous donors also provide our seniors with a special gift to say, "We Care." We invite the community to participate in these initiatives year-round, with an additional initiative during the holiday months.

This past year, we delivered 776 gifts: 350 bags in round one, 416 in round two, and 10 gift cards donated by Brookshire's Grocery Store.

The first round of bags were made possible by a gift from the Alton and Fay Talbert Memorial Fund and our local Albertsons. Alton Talbert spent





much of his adult life as a cattle and hog farmer, so it's fitting that a gift in his memory would go toward providing meals to people in need.








With the addition of two more counties, our army of staff and volunteers now mobilize across 3,401 square miles.

In FY22, 509 volunteers delivered 14,648 routes, providing meals to 1,503 senior adults.

Established in 1976, the organization began serving senior adults in Johnson County. In 2001, Meals on Wheels North Central Texas answered its first call for expansion, accepting and serving seniors in Ellis County. Then, in 2020, the organization expanded again to include Navarro County, followed by another expansion into Somervell and Hood counties in 2022.

A VOLUNTEER EXPLAINS WHY SHE'S SO PASSIONATE ABOUT MEALS ON WHEELS

aura has volunteered with Meals on Wheels for about five years as part of the Corsicana Rotary Club. She explains why she does it:

"It's a rewarding experience to be able to know you are helping people directly in your community," she says. "I'm not donating my resources somewhere way off. It's happening right here in Corsicana."

Laura knows that her service is about so much more than delivering meals.

"Elderly people need someone to check on them, especially if they don't have family here to check on them. You are actually a person going to their door, making sure that person is okay. We look around and see if there is anything they need help with."

Her visits are so important to the older neighbors she serves. So often, Laura is the only person that senior might see all day. And the regular wellness checks that come along with meal deliveries give older adults and their families peace of mind.
